WHO IS OUR CLIENT?

An individual who works at least 27 weeks per year, but their cash income still falls below the federal poverty level measured by the size of the family.

Based on the 2020 SC Self-Sufficiency Standard, a single adult in Richland County can meet basic needs on \$26,404 annually. The average income of our crisis clients is less than \$18,558 annually.
